The marriage of Miss Patsy Ruth Kennedy and Clifton Lee Quinn was solemnized in an impressive ceremony December 19, at the Beulaville Presbyterian church. The church was decorated with long leaf pine, palms and garlands of white gladioli, chrysanthemums and fern. Rev. J. Morrison officiated and the wedding music rendered by Mrs. Thigpen, pianist, and Miss Mae Quinn, soloist, included "Chant de Lune," "Evening Star," "Lobstrausen," and "Traumeri."

The traditional wedding marches, "Sous le Palmier" and "Mendelssohn" were used, and "None But The Lonely Heart" was played softly during the ceremony. Miss Quinn sang "The Lord's Prayer" as a benediction. Mrs. Thigpen was wearing black with which she wore a corsage of red carnations and Miss Quinn was dressed in blue, having a corsage of pink carnations. Mrs. Paul Hunter of San Angelo, Texas, sister of the bride, was maid of honor. She wore a suit of grey gaberdine with black accessories. 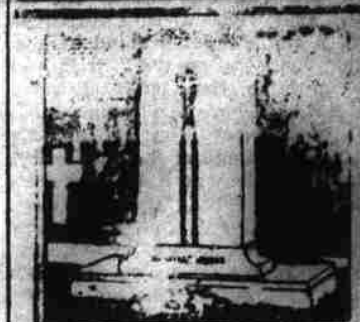
