#### **Nations Affacking** Stock Diseases

The entire world will soon be benefiting from methods employed in North Carolina in curbing livestock diseases, it has been announ ced by Dr. William Moore of State Department of Agriculture.

He finds that the United Nations organizations has accepted the recommendations of its veterinary advisors for a world-wide program aimed at controlling livestock diseases in order to increase food production. Plans similar to those followed in this State in controlling Bang's disease and cattle tick will be used.

One step, will be the prompt use of vaccines, chemicals, and similar products. Vaccines have already been sent to East Africa and China, where cattle diseases are serious problem.

### **Change Requested** For Food Division

A move to permit the Food Division of the State Department of Agriculture to derive its appropri ations from the General Fund was begun by Agriculture Comm er D. S. Coltrane recently.

He explained that the work of this Division is not confined to agriculture, but serves all segmen of the population in protecting the consumer against contaminated sub-standard, and mislabeled foods and drinks.
