Advice On Blue Mold Control

Raleigh, N. C. — Dr. J. H. Jensen, Plant Pathologist, N. C. Agricultural Experiment Station advises that in using FERMATE for blue mold control on tobacco plants, the first application should be applied when the plants are the size of a dime. Thereafter the treatments should be continued twice weekly until all danger of an attack is over.

FERMATE may be used as a dust or a spray. As a dust the cost is somewhat greater, but it is easier and more quickly applied than the spray.

To prepare the material for dusting the FERMATE is mixed with pyrophyllite so that the final mixture contains 15 percent of FERMATE. A good crank-type duster should be used, with the hopper never filled more than 2-3 full to assure an even flow. The dust should be applied in the early morning when the air is still and while the plants are wet with dew. The first applications will require one and one-half pounds of the dust mixture for each 100 square yards of bed gradually increasing to where three to four pounds will be required for the last applications.

Legislative Summary

Monday through Friday, Feb. 14, of the full week of the 1947 session saw the introduction of 99 new bills, for a total of 494, as against 142 bills introduced during the corresponding period of the 1945 legislative session. At the close of the

legislative day, the House was running practically even with the 1946 House in terms of the number of bills introduced, with 99 bills in the hopper as against 1945's 342. The Senate, however, was somewhat behind, with only 141 bills as against 179 in 1945.

Of the 99 bills introduced thru Friday of last week, 63, or 63.6% were local bills concerned with the usual run of local matters. For example, 11 deal with local salaries

Here is a letter from a farmer about an experience he had with natural soda on his corn. It is offered here in the hope that you will find his suggestion helpful and profitable.

The Farmer's Forum from Uncle Natchel's Book of Experience

"On a field of corn where I had a good stand, I sidedressed it with 250 lbs. per acre of Chilean Nitrate when the corn was knee high. Just to see what would happen, I doubled the sidedressing on a few rows and on the next rows left it off altogether. When we checked up on the results, I found that the corn that had not gotten any soda had fired above the ears; that which got the 250 pounds showed a little firing, while the corn that got double, had not fired at all. I used to think that firing was caused by dry weather but now I believe it really is hunger for nitrate."
