



### **Questions And Answers To. Vets**

Q. I have a blue discharge from the Army. Am I entitled to benefits under the GI Bill?

A. If it is found that your discharge was issued under conditions other than dishonorable, you will

be eligible under the GI Bill. Q. I am an American Indian and a World War II veteran. Am I eli-

gible for a GI loan? A. Yes, but it must be on property you own or plan to own out-side the reservation. You cannot secure a GI loan to build a home

Q. Will the VA accept collect telephone calls made by physicians who wish to ascertain whether they Mr. and Mrs. Edgar Banks are will be paid for emergency treatments given veterans?

> A. Yes. Q. I am a World War I veteran and I was married in June, 1945. Is my wife entitled to receive a pension when I die?

> A. A widow of a World War I veteran is entitled to receive a pension if she was married to the veteran before Dec. 14, 1944, or for

10 years or more. Consequently your wife wouldn not be eligible for pension if you died less than 10 years after your marriage.
