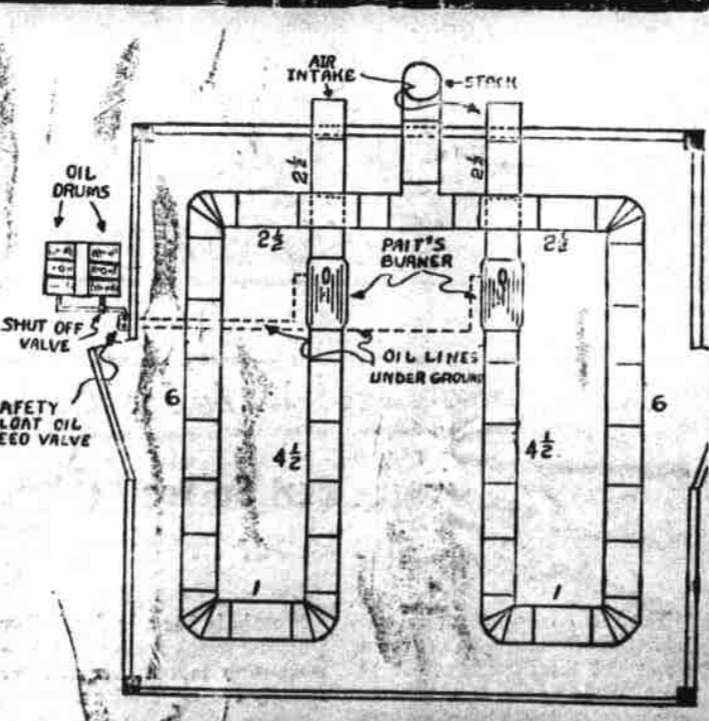
### Entertain Faculty At Luncheon
