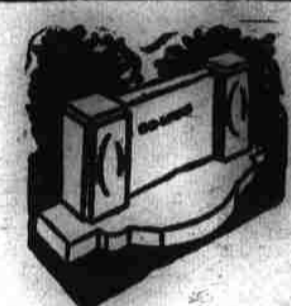
Wedding music was rendered by Miss Madelyn Cottle, pianist and Miss Vena Mae Quinn, soloist. Traditional wedding marches were used.
