SOUTHERN FARM MARKET SUMMARY

Shipments of fresh fruits and vegetables began streaming to market this week in large volume.

Southern livestock also went to market in greater numbers. Packer buyers furnished a ready market outlet for most cattle, but large supplies of low grade animals, in some places, went to .50 a hundred pounds lower. Good grade steers topped at \$23.75 and choice fed topped the market at \$26 a hundred pounds.

Hog prices were both higher and lower, with advances of about 50 cents where supplies were light, and declines of around 25c elsewhere.

Cotton prices gained more than half a cent this week.

Fowl, abundant at all markets, continued to sell at barely steady to weak prices except in Raleigh. Eggs supplies dwindled with prices firm on eggs of top quality.

Announces Date For Forestry Camp

The annual forestry camp for farm boys, operated by the N. C. Division of Forestry and Parks will be held at Singletary Lake in the Bladen Lakes State Forest near Elizabethtown from Aug. 25-31.

The purpose is to acquaint farm boys with good methods of forest protection and management and to give instruction in the use of fire fighting equipment, timber estimating, timber harvest, selective cutting, timber stand improvement, and reforestation. The boys will have plenty of time for swimming, sports and other recreation.

The camp will be limited to 50 boys, 25 4-H boys and 25 FFA boys. There will be no charges except for transportation to and from camp.

The sponsors are the Southern Pulpwood Conservation Association, the Champion Paper and Fibre Co., of Canton, The N. C. Pulp Co. of Plymouth and the Riegall Paper Corp., of Bolton. These sponsors are providing funds to cover the cost of camp operation, meals and lodging.
