Old Age Overtakes **Museum Snake**

Raieigh, July 12 — One of the State Museum's best-known inhabi-tants is dead.

The passing of Columbia, the 6 foot cottonmouth moccasin snake, was reported by Frank B. Meacham, who attributed death to old age and loss of appetite.

Columbia was 18 years old. The ım obtained him from the southeastern part of the State on May 10, 1934. He represented one of the two poisinous species of moccasins found in North Carolina, the other being the highland moc-

In attributing death to old age and loss of appetite, Meacham explained that 78 is a ripe old age for snakes. And it could be that Columbia's loss of appetite stemmed from a somewhat monotonous diet, consisting mostly of rate but also including fish and other
