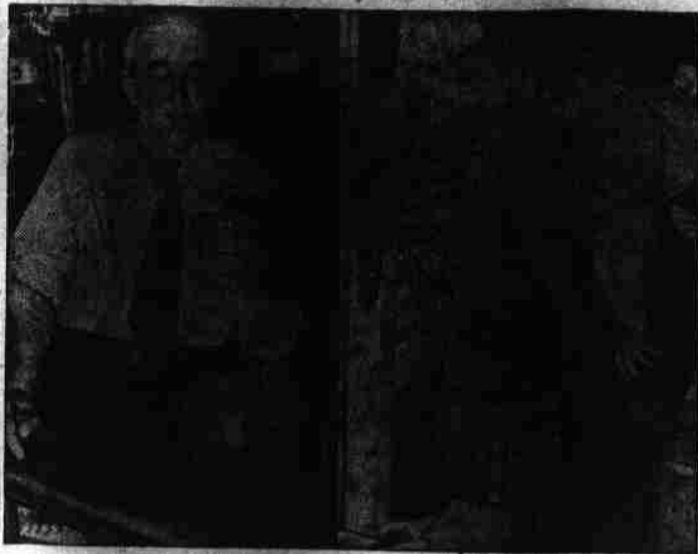

## Old Age Overlakes Museum Snake

Raleigh, July 12 — One of the State Museum's best-known inhabitants is dead.

The passing of Columbia, the 6 foot cottonmouth moccasin snake, was reported by Frank B. Meacham, who attributed death to old age and loss of appetite.

Columbia was 18 years old. The museum obtained him from the southeastern part of the State on May 10, 1934. He represented one of the two poisonous species of moccasins found in North Carolina, the other being the highland moccasin or copperhead.

For 12 years, Meacham reported, Columbia helped to teach a valuable lesson about poisonous snakes. He was viewed by about 130,000 visitors.

In attributing death to old age and loss of appetite, Meacham explained that 78 is a ripe old age for snakes. And it could be that Columbia's loss of appetite stemmed from a somewhat monotonous diet, consisting mostly of rats but also including fish and other snakes.

Columbia was the only cottonmouth moccasin in the museum.
