He was known as "Mickey," the youngest member of the "Our Gang" comedians, who were working 5 years for Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer. When his five year contract terminated he was promoted to features. He played his first starring and title in "Mokey," an M.G.M. production.

He has completed a total of 147 pictures in his 7 year span in Hollywood.

BOBBY has already co-starred as "LITTLE BEAVER" with Bill Elliott in the "RED RYDER" features. BOBBY'S favorite outdoor activities are horseback riding and hunting with his father. For that reason he is constantly annoyed when the director makes his 42-year old stand-in and double, John Bankberry, do BOBBY'S stunts and difficult horseback riding. BOBBY prefers to do it himself.

BOBBY'S mother and father have been very thrifty with his money and have put the most of it in war bonds.

The winner of the Senior group will attend the Short Course in Raleigh to enter the State Contest.

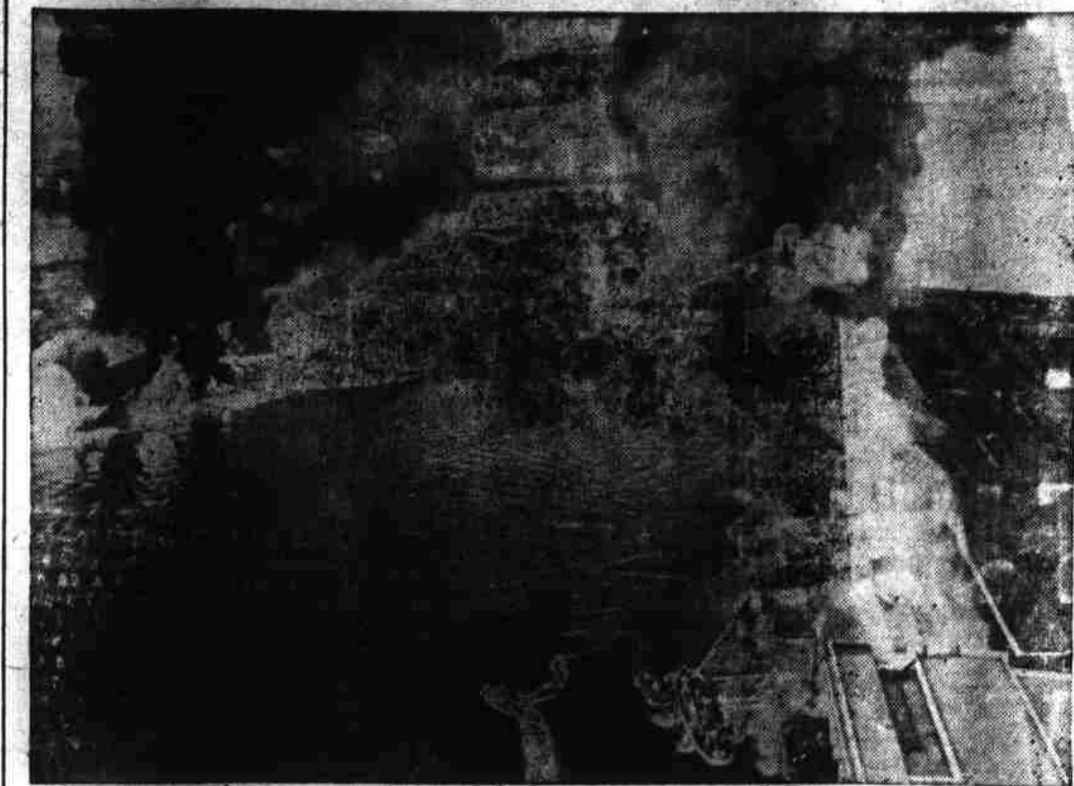

Tobacco Requires More Farm Labor

Raleigh, July 12. — Tobacco requires more than half of North Carolina farm labor's total crop hours although it is exceeded in acreage by several crops, it was revealed in a survey reported by the Federal-State Crop Reporting Service.

The report explained that tobacco requires more work per acre than any other crop. Farmers in North Carolina harvest almost twice as many acres and pounds of tobacco than those of any other State.

Almost three-fourths of all farm work done in North Carolina is devoted to crops, the report stated. Slightly more labor is devoted to farm maintenance than to live-

stock. Labor requirements for wheat and cotton have increased since 1939 because of greater yields on additional acres, but labor for corn and tobacco went down, despite a higher yield, because of sharply decreased acreage.
