**New Type Curb Used In Rose Hill**  
 Rose Hill's \$108,000 street improvement program is moving along rapidly.  
 Twenty-three of the twenty-six blocks in the project have concrete curbs and gutters substantially finished, lacking a small number of drive ways and catch basin entrances yet to be built.

Sidewalk construction, also included in each of the 26 blocks, began July 1st and will be expedited when curb and gutter workmen are released the latter part of the week to assist in the sidewalk work. Water and sewer system improvements and storm sewer construction have already been completed, with the exception of certain minor alterations required by preparation of the 5 and 6 inch cement base to be laid before asphalt surface treatment is applied to the streets.  
 The modernistic curb and gutter design used on the project has attracted the attention of national engineer's associations, which have had representatives inspect the work in Rose Hill. The curbs were designed to prevent damage to automobile tires, an improvement developed during the war.

**Warehouses To Collect Tobacco Assessments**  
 Raleigh — Warehousemen will collect an assessment of 10 cents an acre from the flue-cured tobacco farmers of the Carolinas, the board of directors of Tobacco Associates, Inc., has decided.  
 The board said the collection would be made the first sale of each farmer, with the warehouseman stamping the farmer's allotment card the amount of assessment collected.  
 The levy is applicable to flue-cured growers of the Carolinas and to any sales farmer of those states may make beyond its borders. Non-assessment warehousemen are authorized to make collections on sales of tobacco from the Carolinas.

**Rose Hill Tax Rate Still \$1.00 On \$100**
