## Witherington Is Top Man In Mount Olive Pickle Industry

Mt. Olive, N. C.,—\$7,500,000,000 cucumbers are just cucumbers, but with warts on them they mean about \$6,000,000,000 added to the total U. S. income.

Cucumbers with warts on them generally become pickles, because you folks say so, and because the bumpy cucumbers have the firmness, small water content and yeast enough to make good, tasty pickles. That yeast . . . . .

Of the \$6,000,000 paid for pickles (wholesale) in the U. S. in most years, the Mt. Olive Pickle Co. takes about \$1,200,000 gross, which is considerably above the 1925 figure of \$15,000. But that first year sales figure was an exhilarating one to the Mt. Olive Booster Club and I. E. Witherington, Chamber of Commerce secretary, who had set about converting surplus cucumbers into cash. Witherington, by the way, is still top-man in Mt. Olive pickles, although the plant growth from small thousands in 1931 to a large million now is the career story of Harry Kraft, one time Heinz Pickle Company man who was born "in a pickle patch" in Chicago, and hired by Witherington to make Carolina Beauties (the A&P exclusive brand), Way Packs, Mopicks, and other sweet, sour and dill pickles.

Pickle men will tell you, simply and earnestly, that the good Lord put yeast into the skin of cucumbers especially and only to make pickles. These facts are true, scientifically, of all pickle material only cucumbers have an experimental variable of natural yeast content; the yeast is in the outside skin where it can be easily got at in preserving processes; and cucumbers really make good pickles.

Mt. Olive Pickle Co. recently introduced the assembly line to pickle making, among the first to adapt the new "pickle pasteurizing" method.

One difficulty Mt. Olive has under control but far from solved is the question of keeping warts on cucumbers. In the immediate Mt. Olive area, bumpy cucumbers are not popular . . . far from it. For fresh consumption cucumbers are as slick as Uncle Harry's bald head. Growers love them for two reasons, first, they are quickly grown, and second they will bring a never-predictable price on the auction market.

The fact that the season, overall income per farmer of commercial cukes never equals the contract of pickle cukes never fazes the cuke grower. For he is a born gambler, and cukes, one of the quick, short season crops, are the idle chips for his agricultural poker game. He takes a trimming four years out of five at the hands of Mother Nature and from those who know selling markets better than he, but he has his fun.

Mt. Olive, of course, takes up a bit of that beating by going on the market to round out contract shortages.

Of the three-quarter billion pickles produced at the Mt. Olive plant each year, only a quarter-billion are used straight from the field at harvest time. A half-billion are packed neatly in brine tanks covering almost two acres back of the plant safely and hygienically planted in water, salt, and their own yeast to await the pleasure of the pickle packing pasteuriser inside. They are as fresh as Santa Claus time (fact is, gift package business is the neatest and one of the biggest profits of the plant) as at June bride season.
