MEDALS: General distri-
bution of the
American De-
fense Service
Medal and the
World War II
Victory Medal
starts in Aug-
ust. Fisheries,
Navy, Marine,
Coast and
Geodetic

FOR DEFENSE
will make the
distribution.
Veterans must
apply only to
that branch of
the Armed
Forces in
which they
served.
In general,
distribution
will be made
to veterans and
eligible next of kin from local dis-
tribution centers. All local Army
distribution centers will be pre-
pared to take care of applications
by Aug. 30 and Army applicants
should wait until that date before
applying for medals unless ad-
vised otherwise locally.

FOR VETERANS
It is estimated that the four
branches of service will distribute
approximately 2,400,000 medals if
all eligible apply, divided as fol-
lows:
Army: 1,000,000
Navy: 400,000
Marine: 300,000
Coast and Geodetic: 200,000
and 25,000
of these medals were discharged

honorably are eligible for the
medals.
In general, the American De-
fense Medal is for those who
served between Sept. 8, 1939, and
Dec. 7, 1941, inclusive. The World
War II Victory Medal is for active
service between Dec. 7, 1941, and
Dec. 31, 1946, inclusive.

SLED: The Army Ground Forces'
one-ton cargo snow sled, which
proved highly successful in trials
in Alaska, now is sliding over the
hot desert sands of Arizona. It
is being tested by Task Force
"Purnace" and if it survives the
rugged demands of desert terrain,
the Army will have a low-cost,
light-weight, heavy-duty trailer
equally efficient on snow or sand.
The sled is towed behind stand-
ard or special prime movers. It
is eight feet, eight inches long, and
four feet four inches wide and it
rides on two steel runners.

MERCI: In behalf of the French
Republic, Lieut. Gen. Maurice
Mathonet, military attaché,
thanked the 78th Armored Field
Artillery Battalion at Camp Hood,
Tex., for the way it fought in 1944.
"A choice unit, which fought
brilliantly in the region of St.
Denis le Gast," said the citation
accompanying the award of the
Croix de Guerre with silver star
to the battalion. "On July 30,
1944, it was attacked by an ar-
mored column which had succeeded
in penetrating its formation. It
fought immediately with all its
force and, after two hours of
fierce combat, the enemy was
driven back, leaving on the field 97
vehicles and 1,200 dead."
