Sawmill On Wheels To Be Displayed At Farm & Home Week

First, rinse the stain several times in water to stop the action of the acid. Then apply baking soda or ammonia water. If soda is used, sprinkle it on both sides of the stain, moisten and let stand several minutes, then rinse well. If ammonia is used, hold the damp stain over an open bottle of strong ammonia water.

If you have never seen a sawmill on wheels that can travel over a community like a combine or thrasher, then you will want to see this machine on display at State College during Farm & Home Week. It is said that the machine can be set down in 30 minutes and will cut up to 10,000 board feet of lumber per day.

Included with the Forestry Exhibit will be a tree planting machine, fire protection equipment, chain saws, bow saws, and circular saws on wheels. The tree planting machines are so designed so that three men can plant 12,000 trees daily.
