# **Dates Your Present Drivers License** Will Expire; Better Take Note

Department Of Motor Vehicles Regulation No. 3 Subject: Expiration of Operators Licenses

This regulation is promulgated by the Commissioner of Motor Vehicies of North Carolina pursuant to authority granted in Sub-section (b) of Section 20-39 of the General Statutes of North Carolina.

All operators' licenses issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles prior to July 1, 1947 shall expire as follows in accordance with G. S. 20-7 (d) and the holders thereof shall not be permitted to operate Motor Vehicle over the Highways of North Carolina unless they se cure new operators' licenses as re-

(b) A license issued to a person whose last or surname begins with the letter "A" or the letter "B" shall expire at midnight, December

(n) A license issued to a persan whose last or surname begins with the letter "C" or the letter "D" shall expire at midnight, June 30,

(c) A license issued to a person whose last or surname begins with the letter "E", "F" or "G" shall expire at midnight, December 31, 1948;

(d) A license issued to a person whose last or surname begins with the letter "H", "I", "J" or "K" shall expire at midnight, June 30,

(e) A license issued to a person whose last or surname begins with the letter "L" or the letter "M" shall expire at midnight, December 31, 1949;



**Farm Questions** Q. What can I do to control disand weeds in tobacco plant beds? A. Cyanamid will control weed but not tobacco diseases in the soll. Uramon will aid in killing weeds and will also kill such soil borne

> shank, root knot, and Granville Use 11b of Uramon and 1/21b of Cyanamid per square yard of bed. Where there has been toxic effects, change to 1/2 lb of Uramon and 1/2 lb

> of Cynamid per sq. yd. The chemicals need moisture to ecome active. If the soil is drying out, give the bed a good watering soon after application.

Q. Is it necessary that hogs be fed a protein supplement made up of products from animal sour

A. Yes. At least 1-5, by weight of the protein supplement should ome from animal sources, such as digester tankage or high grade fish meal. Two gallons skim milk or buttermilk will replace 11b of fish meal or tankage. The remainder ces such as cottonseed meal, etc. | fect day.
