Cotton is second only to tobacco as a cash crop in North Carolina, Ashford pointed out.

"Inventories of cotton manufac turers are more depleted than in many years," he said, "and cotton can be planted without a complete change in farming operations. we are proud of the improved living standard of our farm people, and we cannot afford to stand by and face a 20% reduction in cash income, without making some effort
