"On the other hand, if the man s publicly executed in the vicinity where he committed the crime, it would serve as a warning to the witnesses not to attempt to get away with the same thing.

"I do not advocate making a picnic out of an execution, but I contend that since we do have capital punishment and since it is legal under law that we should use it more effectively as a crime deerrent," Wilson said.
