 Q. What is a good recipe for making sausage?
 A. 1 lb table salt, 2 1/2 oz. of finely ground black pepper, and 2 oz. of sage for 50 lb of pork, 3/4 lean 1/4 fat. Mix thoroughly and then spread evenly over the meat. Stir the meat well before chopping.
 Another: For 50 lb trimmings, use 1 lb salt, 1 1/2 oz ground sage, 1 1/2 oz black pepper and 1 1/2 oz of red pepper.

- Elimination of fire loss by putting into practice the following:
1. Kerosene stored in metal containers outside of house.
 2. Metal screen in front of open fireplace.
 3. Wiring in dwelling completely rechecked.
 4. Fire extinguisher in convenient location in house.
 5. Dead leaves and rubbish removed from around buildings.
 6. Sparrow nests removed from buildings.
 7. Metal containers provided for matches.
 8. Ladders stored in convenient places to be used in case of fire

Old Belt Tobacco Market Report

Danville, Va. Oct. 18.—The great-

est drop of the season both in prices and quality occurred during the fourth week of sales on the Old Belt flue-cured tobacco markets. Most decreases were from \$1 to \$4 per hundred but a few grades lost as much as \$6 when compared with the previous week. In most instances better qualities were steady to \$2 lower while losses for inferior grades declined from \$3 to \$6. A good many grades dropped to their lowest levels of the season. The few increases were from \$1 to \$4 and were mostly for green and red tobacco with limited volume.

Eastern Flue-Cured Tobacco News

Oct. 18.—Tobacco prices were irregular during the week with the trend weaker. Rainy weather, which caused offerings to show "high order" was the contributing factor in causing price irregularities according to trade reports. Most of the leaf grades closed in Eastern North Carolina markets at \$24.00 to \$57; cutters \$57 to \$60.; and lugs \$50 to \$58. The State's Middle Belt markets reported closing leaf prices at \$21.50 to \$55; cutters \$55 to \$58; and lugs \$30 to \$58. Old Belt Markets reported closing prices for most leaf grades at \$22.50 to \$60; cutters \$56 to \$60; lugs \$32 to \$54; and primings \$20 to \$30. Only three Border Belt markets will be open for sales during next week, Farmont and Lumberton, N. C., and Mullens, S. C.

Southern Farm Market Summary

Oct. 17. — Southern livestock marketings slacked off sharply this week, and cattle prices rebounded again to levels near those of two weeks ago, with hog prices up even more. Cattle arrivals declined about 37 per cent from the previous week; calf arrivals were off 6 per cent, and hogs declined slightly. Hog prices moved higher at most southern markets, with advances to as much as \$1.00 with tops in Nashville at \$28.75. Southern and eastern broiler markets were weak to lower in the major-producing areas, with supplies in excess of moderate to slow demand. Eggs advanced from two to three cents a dozen in Raleigh at the close of the week. Offerings continued light. Hurricanes have greatly reduced the volume of vegetables to be harvested this year. Cotton prices gained more than 1/2 cent a pound during the week. Prices for Middling 15-16 inch averaged 31.68 a pound Friday.
