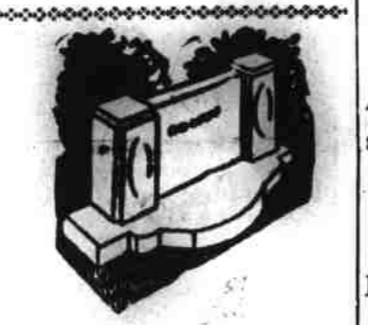
Circles Meet
