C., for the following bonds of the County of Duplin, North Carolina, dated December 1, 1947, and maturing annually, June 1, as follows, without option of prior payment: \$57,000 Refunding Road and Bridge Bonds maturing annually \$19,000 1964 to 1966, inclusive. 9,000 Refunding School Bonds maturing annually \$3,000 1964 to 1966, inclusive. Denomination \$1,000, principal and semi-annual interest (J and D 1), payable in New York City in

legal tender; general obligations; unlimited tax; coupon bonds negotiable as to principal, alone; delivery on or about December 17, 1947, at place of purchaser's choice. There will be no auction. A separate bid for each issue (not less than par and accrued interest) is required. Bidders are requested to name the interest rate or rates, not exceeding 6% per annum in multiples of 1/4 of 1%; each bid may name one rate for part of the bonds of either issue (having the earliest maturities) and another rate for the balance, but no bid may name more than two rates for either issue. The bonds will be awarded to the bidder offering to purchase the bonds at the lowest interest cost to the County, such cost to be determined by deducting the total amount of the premium bid from the aggregate amount of interest upon all of the bonds until their respective maturities.

Bids must be on a form to be furnished with additional information by the undersigned, enclosed in a sealed envelope marked "Proposal for Bonds", and must be accompanied by a certified check upon an incorporated bank or trust company, payable unconditionally to the order of the State Treasurer of North Carolina for \$1,320.
