A red and diamond shape, will be on vehicles which fail to meet the minimum safety requirements. (Owners of cars which the reddiamond sticker is affixed will have a certain length of time in which to have their vehicles placed in good repair, at which time it may be retexamined without additional cost.)

An 8 by 10 inch, yellow sticker, bearing a red cross, will gon on vehicles found to be absolutely unsafe for the highways. Such vehicles will be labelled CONDEMNED, and cannot be driven away from the inspection stations.
