**Life Sketch Of  
Sen. W. B. Umstead**  
William B. Umstead is the son of

John W. and Lullie Lunsford Umstead and was born and reared on a tobacco farm in the northern part of Durham County and worked on the farm until after he was 21 years of age. He has lived in Durham County all his life. He was graduated from the University of North Carolina in 1916.

He taught school at Kinston, 1916-17; left in May 1917 to enter the first officer's training camp at Ft. Oglethorpe. He was commissioned a Second Lieutenant, assigned to the 317th Machine Gun Battalion, 81st Division, and served with this outfit until released from service in the spring of 1919. He served about eight months overseas.

Mr. Umstead entered law school at Trinity College, now Duke University, in the fall of 1919, and obtained his law license in August

1920. He began the practice of law July 1, 1921 and was elected Prosecuting Attorney of the Durham County Recorders Court in 1922 and was re-elected in 1924. In 1926 he was elected Solicitor of the Tenth Judicial District and was re-elected in 1930. In 1932, he was elected to Congress in the Sixth

Congressional District and re-elected in 1934 and 1936, retiring voluntarily at the end of his third term. He returned to Durham and re-entered the practice of law. In the spring of 1944, he managed the primary campaign for Honorable R. Gregg Cherry, who was a candidate for governor. In August 1944 he was elected Chairman of the State Democratic Executive Committee and conducted the State campaigns in 1944 and in 1946. On

December 18, 1946, Mr. Umstead was appointed by Governor Cherry to serve the unexpired term of Senator Josiah W. Bailey.

Senator Umstead was married to Merle D. Davis of Rutherford County in 1929, and they have one daughter, Merle Bradley, who is five years of age. He is a Methodist and a member of the Board of Stewards of Trinity Methodist Church of Durham, N. C., and served as Chairman of the Board for four years. He is a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and has been active in Post No. 7, American Legion, for many years, serving as Commander of the Post for seven years. He has been Chairman of the Durham Chapter of the American Red Cross, member of the Board of Directors of the Dur-

ham Chamber of Commerce, member of the Durham County Board of Health, and other civic committees. He served as Appeal Agent for Draft Board No. 1 for 3 1/2 years during the war, and also served as President of the Alumni Association of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He is a member of the Board of Trustees of the Greater University of North Carolina.

While a student at the University he won the Mangum Medal and was an intercollegiate debater. He belongs to the Durham County Bar Association, the State Bar Association, the American Bar Association, and is a Mason.

While a member of the House of Representatives, he served on the Appropriations Committee, and at

the time of his retirement, he was Chairman of the Sub-Committee on Appropriations for the Navy Department. While a member of Congress, he served on the Sub-Committee on Appropriations for the Department of Agriculture and devoted a great deal of time to the development of our present farm policy and program. He supported and voted for the Agricultural Adjustment Act, the Rural Electrification Act, the Farm Tenant Purchase Program, Soil Conservation Act, and the Tobacco Control Act.
