Mrs. Brinson was born in Wilmington, N. C., July 21, 1905, moving to Beulaville in early childhood. She was active in church and civic life, having been a lifelong member of the Beulaville Baptist Church and a charter member of the Womans Club. After graduation from the local high school, she attended Pineland College at Salernburg and Sprunt Institute in Kenansville. For a number of years she taught in the Duplin County schools and at the time of her death she was a member of the Pink Hill school faculty.
