NOTICE OF DISCONTINUANCE OF

ATLANTIC COAST LINE PASSENGER TRAINS 45 - 46

Pursuant to authority of North Carolina Utilities Commission, Atlantic Coast Line Railroad Passenger Trains 45 and 46, operating between Rocky Mount and Wilmington, will be discontinued with last trips both southbound and northbound Sunday, January 4, 1948.

And concurrent therewith, the through sleeping car operating on those trains between Wilmington and New York will be withdrawn from service. Passengers holding space in that sleeping car after January 4, 1948, should consult ticket agent.
