One of the reasons for the continued popularity of informal provincial furnishings is that they are suitable for either city or country living. The liberal use of white for the woodwork and the shag rug brings out the gay colors in the wall paper and the plaid upholstery. The same red, green, and white of the apples and leaves in the wall paper are carried out in the gingham which covers the loveseat and chair. The one wall of dark green contrasts brightly with these vivid colors.
