### Thurs. P. M. Club

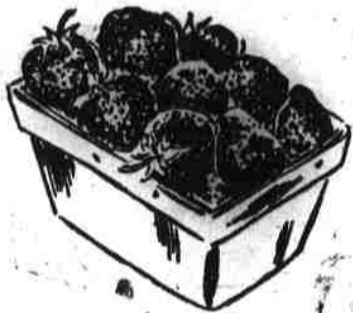

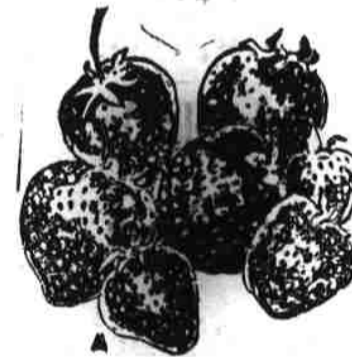
