Mills Stress Quality Control



An employe of a modern New England textile mill is shown operating a new application of the photo-electric cell, popularly known as the electric eye. The device keeps the lengthwise and crosswise yarns in the fabric at right angles as it passes through the wet-straightener en route from bleaching bins to dryer. As a result of this invention, miles of fabric now pass through the mill's bleaching-drying system daily, at the rate of 100 yards a minute, with a minimum of "seconds" or other loss due to distorted yarn in the cloth.

JOYCE KILMER FOREST NEVER TO FEEL WOODSMAN'S AXE

Far back in the Great Smoky Mountains of North Carolina is an aboriginal stand of timber which will never feel the woodsman's axe. The Joyce Kilmer Memorial Forest will remain inviolate as a tribute to the man who wrote perhaps the most moving and widely known poem ever dedicated to trees. The 3,800-acre tract might easily have inspired Kilmer's verse. It is a virgin stand of Appalachian hardwoods, cove type, with an average of 6,100 board feet per acre. There are individual hemlocks 70 inches in diameter and 130 feet tall, and yellow poplars 80 inches in diameter and 170 feet tall. A dense growth of rhododendron 6 to 12 feet high complete the understorey. Joyce Kilmer's most famous poem, which was set to music by his mother, is known by millions:

I think that I shall never see
A poem lovely as a tree.
A tree whose hungry mouth is prest
Against the earth's sweet flowing breast.
A tree that looks at God all day
And lifts her leafy arms to pray
A tree that may in summer wear
A nest of robins in her hair.
Upon whose bosom snow hath lain;
Who intimately lives with rain.
Poems are made by fools like me,
But only God can make a tree.
