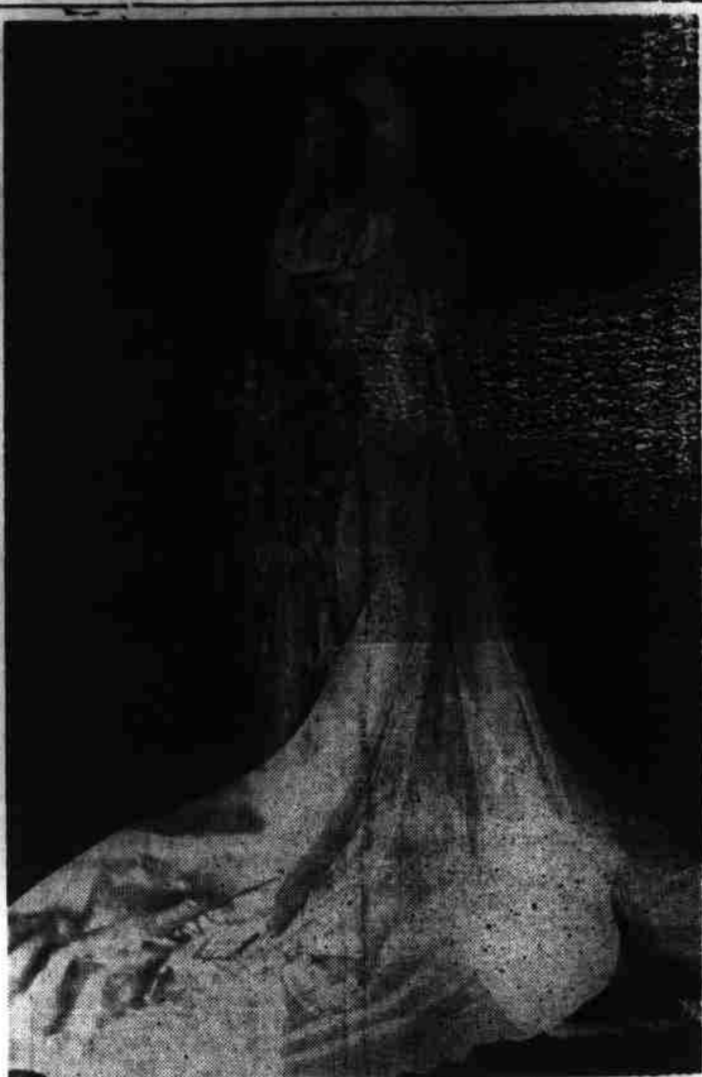
Mrs. Robert L. West opened the meeting with "America", followed by the ritual, led by Chaplain Mrs. C. A. Womack, and the flag salutes.

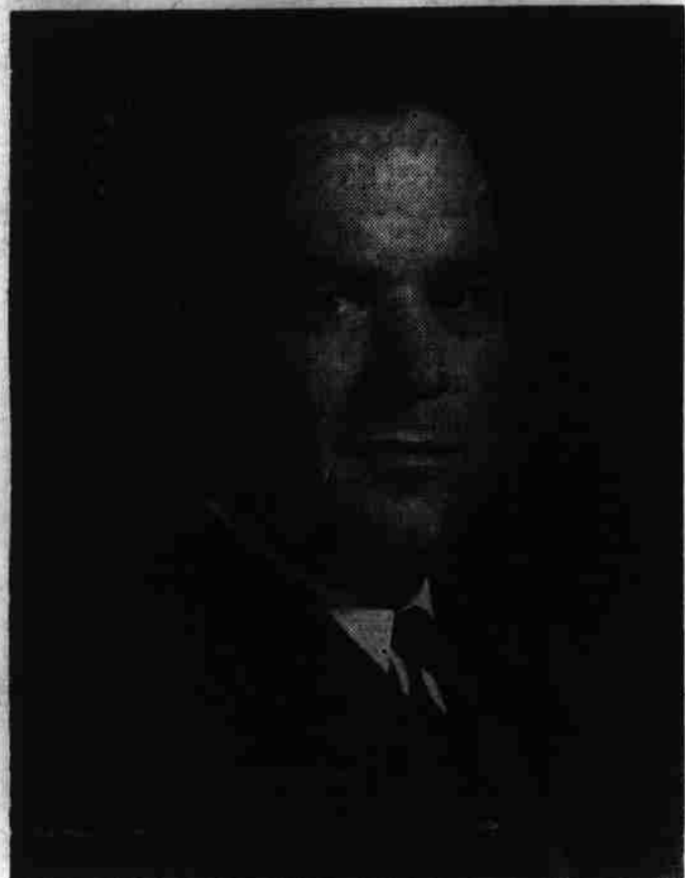
