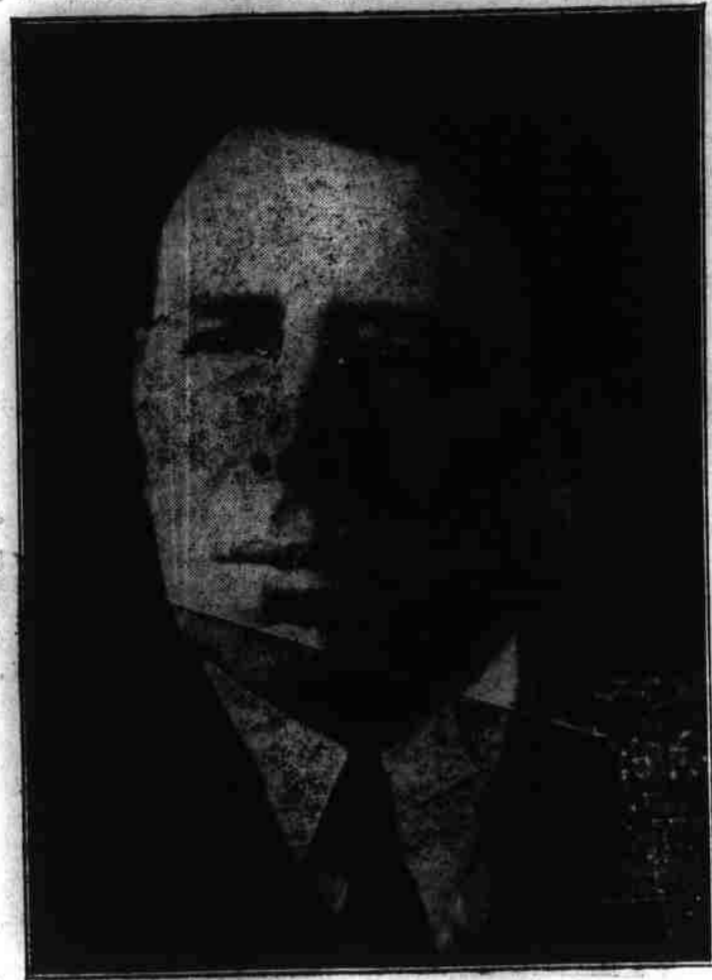

QUOTATION FROM ANNOUNCEMENT FOR SENATE:

"The people of the State will determine whether or not my experience and service as Governor, legislator and in other public capacities qualify me to serve as their representative in the Senate of the United States. My campaign will be addressed to the people. Gubernatorial appointment, under the statute has filled the temporary

vacancy caused by death; but only the people by their votes can decide who will represent them in the Senate for the full term.

"If I am nominated and elected, as I confidently expect to be, I will owe no allegiance except to the people. To their service and to the national welfare I will dedicate all the energy and ability that I possess."

Record As Governor Of North Carolina

J. Melville Broughton was elected Governor of North Carolina in 1940 and served from January 7, 1941, to January 4, 1945. Among the outstanding achievements of the Broughton administration were the following:

1. Enactment of teacher and State employees retirement law.
2. Legislation adding 12th grade to the public school system.
3. 9-months school law.
4. State aid to public libraries (being the first in the South to enact such legislation).
5. Re-organization of State hospitals and correctional institutions under consolidated boards.
6. Enlarged appropriations for agricultural experiment and research.
7. Notable expansion of the schools of dairying and agriculture and the textile and engineering schools at North Carolina State College.
8. Establishment of first State Vocational school in the history of the State, being the textile school located in Gaston County.
9. Inaugurated broad program of mineral research and mineral resources, resulting in building of mineral research laboratory in Asheville and location of U. S. mining building on campus of State College.
10. Organization of Civilian Defense program during war years.
11. Launching of movement for broad medical care and hospital program in North Carolina and appointment of commission to recommend appropriate legislation, which recommendations were later enacted into law.
