Polio Below Normal In N. C. State

Raleigh, N. C.—North Carolina's resort areas are almost entirely free of polio, according to the North Carolina State Health Department.

Charts show that in the 18 counties west of the Blue Ridge, which comprise all of the mountain resort area, there are only three cases of the disease, which is below normal. On the seashore there has been only a single case reported.

Governor Cherry said that it was unfortunate many people have the idea it is unsafe to take their vacations in North Carolina resorts.
