



the same sort of situation brings out the same temptations, the same sins. The prophets often sound quite modern, but that is only because the human race is so old-fashioned

The prophets looked about them and saw a world much like our own. They saw people spending more than they could afford; they saw wealthy women dressing in competition with one another while poorer women starved; they saw crowds of business men attending religious services on Sabbath mornings and spending the rest of the Sabbath figuring out how to cheat their customers on Monday.

The prophets lived in evil times and they brought the judgment of God to such times-then, now and always.

Sins of Society IN AN American town there was a lynching one Saturday hight. The next morning there were four sermons in the four little churches of the town; but not one of the preachers had a word to say about that lynching or any lynching or about the causes that produce such crimes.

The prophets never would have missed an opportunity like that. They were not afraid to speak out, even when they had the whole community against them.

What Does God Require? IT IS easier to say "Don't" than "Do." It is easier to criticize than to construct. But the prophets did not stop with warnings. They have given us a pattern for living, which Micah summed up in those matchless, inspired words: "What doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?'
