The argument was over the formula on which the potato price support program is based. The Department has announced a reduction of potato price support from 90 percent to 60 percent of parity. At the same time it announced an acreage quota system for potatoes based on the number of acres

Barden called the basis of the program a "trick formula" and said "we are tired of having such a formula thrown at us every time we turn our backs." He said the formula seemed set up to serve the West Coast potato growers, and pointed out that the potato crop was being shifted from East to West as a result of the Department's price support program.




