Southern Farm Market Summary
Cattle and hog prices continued to decline this week as southern markets, in line with price drops at midwestern centers, but movement of livestock changed but very little.
Hog prices dropped to as much as \$1.25 a hundred pounds, and

were at or near the lowest price level since October 1946, when price controls ended.
Southern cattle prices declined most on the better grades of steers and heifers. These lost \$1 to \$2 and some early week sales were off \$3.
Broiler markets were generally unsettled with North Carolina prices unchanged to a cent lower.
Fruits and vegetables moved in moderate to liberal volume from southeastern growing areas.
Cotton prices recorded a net decline of \$1.75 a bale with middling 15-16 inch staple averaging 32.29 cents a pound, compared with 32.64 a week earlier.
