### Stevens Postpones Onslow Court Term

Judge Henry L. Stevens, Jr. of Warsaw, resident judge of the Sixth Judicial District, has agreed to postpone the March term of Onslow County Superior Court scheduled to begin March 7, until April 4, due to incompleteness of the Onslow County Courthouse remodeling.

The courthouse will be dedicated on April 4. John Warlick, chairman of the dedication committee, has written Governor Kerr Scott asking if he will attend the ceremonies on that date.

### Southern Farm Market Summary

Livestock prices continued upward this week at southern markets but brought only slight increases in marketward movement of animals.

Most classes of cattle showed advances of 50 cents to \$2 per 100 pounds, and most hog prices were strong and 25 cents to 50 cents higher. The advance followed substantial gains of the week before. Cattle marketings are usually light in late winter at southern points, and the supply of hogs also begins to taper off.

All southern broiler markets were steady to firm during the week, with demand good and movement sufficient to keep stocks well cleared. Prices were a cent higher in central North Carolina.

Middling 15-16 inch cotton closed at 32.74 cents a pound, compared with 32.50 cents a week ago.

### Duplin Needs \$3000 To Insure New Gym.

Duplin County is within \$3,000 of that huge new gymnasium to be erected in Kenansville.

Duplin School Superintendent O. P. Johnson said \$7,000 had been pledged or paid in the last two weeks. He issued this plea:

"Due to the fact that time is short we must urge everyone who can help to please consider the worth of this grand project which is at stake. Proposed auditorium-gymnasium which would greatly benefit Duplin will cost \$60,000.00, of which all but \$3,000.00 is now in sight. In view of the fact that largest commitments are contingent upon our raising the necessary funds to make up the balance and complete the project during 1949, it is in utmost urgency that I ask everyone who can help to do so as soon as possible."

A total of \$20,000.00 has been pledged by the Kenan family to the projected memorial auditorium-gymnasium. William Rand Kenan, Jr., of New York and Florida, has pledged \$10,000.00; Mrs. Graham Kenan, of Wilmington, \$5,000.00;

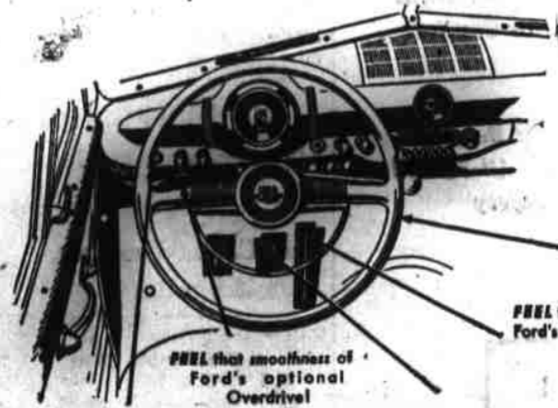

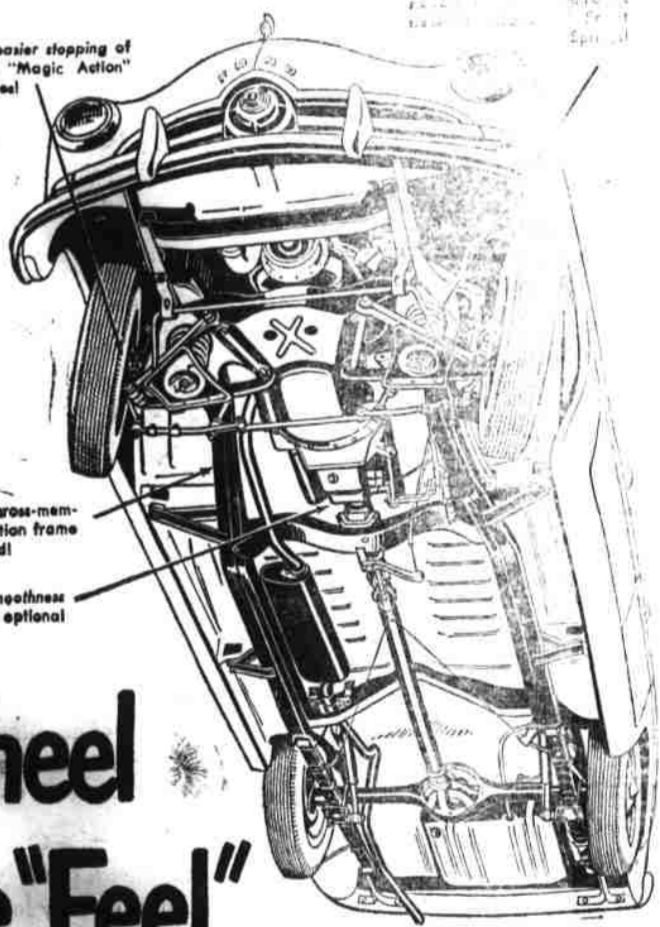
