Boon France found that the Ger-man system was lacking in many respects and attempts were made to improve on it. One glaring weakness was that doctors were force to cater to patients and make compromises. As a consequence the doctor who was most willing to listen to and grant the pationt's requests had the largest and most lucrative practice.

In France the doctors' fees are very low, ranging from 25c to 50c per visit. The patients constantly complain that they do not get the service to which they are entitled, and the doctors grumble on their part because they are paid too little. In order to enhance their income. many French doctors sign sickleave statements for their patients.






