Nancy Holmes SUGGESTS
Bride's Cake
1 cup sifted cake flour
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup candied cherries
1/2 cup citron
1/2 cup white raisins
1 1/2 cups blanched almonds
1 cup vitaminized margarine
1 cup sugar
6 eggs
1/2 cup pineapple juice
1 teaspoon almond extract
Sift 1 1/2 cups flour with baking powder and salt. Chop fruits and nuts into small pieces; roll in remaining 1/2 cup flour. Cream margarine, add sugar gradually, beating until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating vigorously after each addition. Add to mixture the sifted dry ingredients, adding alternately in three portions with the fruit juice and flavoring. Fold in floured fruits and nuts. Turn into a tube pan (9 inches in diameter, or a round pan 8 inches in diameter, 3 inches deep) which has been greased and lined with heavy waxed paper to fit perfectly inside. Bake in a 300° F. oven about 2 hours or until done. Cool and frost with Fluffy White Frosting. Decorate with a border of smilax or green leaves. Bend on tiny silver bells and entwine with Hly-of-the-valley flowers. Yield: 1 cake (about 18 servings).
