Warsaw Town Officials Installed

The new town officials formally took office in Warsaw Friday night following the final adjournment of the retiring board.

Outgoing Mayor A. J. Jenkins, who had served six years, gave the oath of office to incoming Mayor, W. E. Currie, elected by popular vote of the people in the May election. He adjourned the old board after no new business was awaiting action.

Mayor Currie then gave the oath of office to the new five-man Board of Commissioners and the government elected at the regular biennial election May 3 was duly composed and installed in office.

Mr. Jenkins made a brief statement expressing his appreciation to the old commissioners for their splendid cooperation during the past administration. These were Floyd Strickland, A. L. Cavanaugh, J. M. West, B. C. Sheffield, Jr. and S. H. Britt.

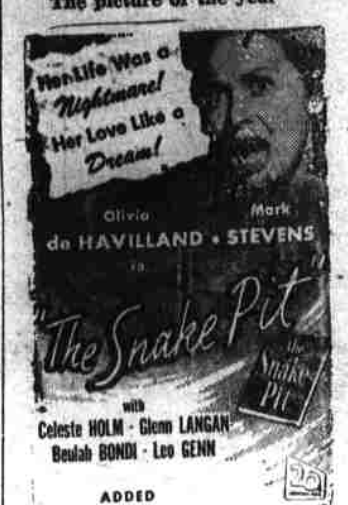

The application of Mrs. Stacy Britt was accepted by the Board for the office of Town Clerk. Mrs. Britt will take over the clerkship which has been held for a number of years by Mrs. Dorcas B. Rogers. This change will become effective July 1, 1941.

The following were appointed to head different departments: Finance, G. C. Brown; Police Commissioner, W. E. Fussell; Water and Sewage, W. W. Blackburn; Street Commissioner, A. Askew; and Commissioner G. S. Best was duly elected Mayor Pro-tem.
