State College Answers Timely Farm Questions

Q. Please give information on Christmas trees as a cash crop in Duplin County.
 A. Red cedar is suitable for planting in your section and seedling of this species may be obtained at reasonable prices from State nurseries. Arrange to plant seedlings during January or February. Prepare the area to be planted just as if you were getting ready to plant an annual crop. Plant trees in rows seven feet wide at six-foot intervals within the row. With this spacing, 1,000 trees will plant an acre. The seedlings should be cultivated, and this can be done by planting a row of soybeans between the rows and then fertilizing the soybeans. Do NOT fertilize the trees. Cultivation may be discontinued after the second or third growing season.
