Frances Lancaster, Edgecombe County girl, and Ralph Brown, Iredell County boy, were crowned Queen and King of Health at a colorful pageant Wednesday evening. Miss Lancaster, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. W. Lancaster of Shatsburg, fought her way back to good health from an attack of TB two years ago. Oddly enough, she had taken an active part in the chest X-ray campaigns against this disease all during the war years.

The Iredell youth was awarded his title for an aggressive drive to improve his own and his family's health. His projects around the farm included anti-rat campaigns, construction of a garbage disposal pit and spray campaigns against mosquitoes and flies.

A 17-year old Chowan County girl, Audrey Pearce of Edenton, took top honors at the dress revue Thursday evening. She won the title with a navy blue rayon crepe dress with navy shoes and bag, straw hat two strands of pearls and white gloves. Second place went to Inez Gustin of Gaston County 4-H'er, with

Marie Shirley of Tarboro winning third. Many of the youngsters including dress revue and health winners won free trips to the National Club Congress in Chicago this fall along with other honors and awards.

### Plan Now For 4-H Baby Beef Project

It is time now to begin planning for the beef calf projects to be started this fall. The outlook for profit on calves fed this winter is better than it has been the last three years, even though feeder calves may be high this fall feed should be cheap and we feel that the calves will sell good at the shows next spring. If you have hay and corn the only feed you would have to buy would be 3 or 4 bags of cotton seed meal. We plan to get beef calves weighing between 400 and 600 pounds for the boys who want us to get calves for them. We would like to see a large number of boys feed calves this fall since it is excellent training and should make you a nice profit if you do a good job. If you are interested in feeding a calf for the Spring Fat Stock Shows, send me a card or letter, or stop by the office to see me by Monday, August 22.

Please discuss this with your parents. If you know any girls who would like to feed a calf, tell them about this, since I am not sending letters to them. Remember the date, Monday, August 22, if you want a calf, let us know by this date so we can make our plans to get them.

### State College Hints To Home Makers

A clean kitchen range looks and also cooks better than one allowed to gather grease spilled food, dust or rust. For full even, efficient heat cleanliness is important. Reflecting surfaces must be kept shining to do their job of throwing out heat. A clean range also keeps the kitchen clean and free of unnecessary smoke and odors. Wipe up spills and splatters as soon as possible. Grease comes off most easily when fresh and hot. Remember a wet cloth on a hot stove is a hazard to hands and may crack enamel. Ovens are often neglected because they are closed and out of sight. Yet a dirty oven may smoke when heated so that foods cooked

in it takes on an unpleasant taste. Leaving the oven open to cool helps keep it clean and fresh and prevents rusting from closed-in steam.

### State College Answers Timely Farm Questions

Q. How can I eliminate mastitis in my dairy herd?  
A. Mastitis can be controlled with practical sanitation measures. Clean, dry stalls with plenty of good litter; good disinfectants such as lye solution or superphosphate to rear half of stall beds; good udder hygiene; early treatment of teat injuries; and partial segregation of active fuses to one end of the milking line.  
Q. I have been dusting my peanuts with copper-sulfur dust's to control leafspot disease. Will the copper residue on leaves be harmful to livestock when I feed the

hay? A. No. Tests have shown that heavy rates of copper dusting left no harmful residues on peanut hay.
