Out behind his modern home is Ed's small turkey enterprise. He is a brother-in-law to the successful producer, James Mainor of Sandy Cross community. This is Ed's first year as a turkey producer and he started with 1,000. Through no fault of his own, some 250 poults died from Omphalitis, commonly known as Navel ill. This disease is usually contracted through improper incubation precautions, however, this disease only occurs from three to ten days after hatching. Ed Dudley now has about 750 vigoriously growing turkeys and is thinking in terms of further diversification in the use of his land.
