

### 1950 Township Farm Census Survey Of 1949 Crops

Every land owner in North Carolina is expected to make a land-use report to his township tax lister in January, 1950. This is not for tax purposes, nor are values or production to be included.

How is this Farm Census information used to benefit the individual farmers?

The benefits usually reach the farmer indirectly, just as is true with most economic and educational programs. After the Department of Agriculture completes the Farm Census, the published results are sent to those directly concerned, such as Crop Reporters, County Agricultural Workers, and other Educational Leaders. They use these County Statistics in developing their own programs for better serving local farmers. Thus, the source and final usage is with the farmer himself. Perhaps the

best of all of the numerous ways in which farmers reap real benefits is the development of farmer thinking through the inventorial thinking habit, which in turn develops better appreciation of the several agricultural programs.

How does this Census Affect our County Allotments?

The Government allots acreages to the State according to their ability to prove past performances. These are broken down to counties according to their ability to prove past performances. In turn, the county breaks it down to individual farms according to their ability to justify past performances. Thus, the more completely and accurately each farmer reports the better the justification all the way up the line.

How might an individual farmer benefit from these reports?

That depends on the individual. Just as our college-trained leaders are raising our general living standards, our agricultural leaders are raising our local farming standards.

The Farm Census provides them the needed local program working material for your individual farm benefits. Through this information, paid agricultural workers have been able to better provide current local and adaptable services based on information which the farmer himself furnished.

Be prepared to give the Farm Census information when you list your taxes in January.
