next door, came daily to see him and would read to him by the hour. On one occasion as he read, "With God all things are possible: All things are possible to him who believes." As the day came, he, in spite of the grave misgivings of his and angry protests of his nurse, insisted that they allow him to dress. So when his friend stopped by, he found him fully dressed and with the exception of being a bit shaky from long lying in bed, he looked very, very handsome, or at least his anxious family thought so. Miraculously, he stood the trip to church well and on his return, insisted that he felt well enough to sit up a while. And dear readers, from that day on, he never remain-

ed all day in bed again. His father insisted on him going back for more x-rays of the heart and lungs and the doctors who had seen him at his worst could hardly believe what the pictures proved. His heart was normal and his lungs seemed completely healed as only the scars remained. He was given permission to go back to his work, although of course cautioned to start off very slowly, and not overdo.

All this happened over fifteen years ago, and at the present time, he is still in fine condition. But during all these years of good health and prosperity, he has never failed to remember that the credit is God's, for only when he turned to Him, did he begin to improve. "Man's extremity is indeed God's opportunity." He knows too that God has blessed him materially as he is now one of the largest real estate owners in the county where he lives. He is very conscientious in trying to use the money that God has given him to help others who haven't been as fortunate. His close friends call him "Santa Claus" because of his daily kind deeds to others. And the strange part is he declares that the more he gives to the unfortunate, the more that seems to come to him. He leads a very busy, happy and full life, but no matter how busy he is, he always takes time before leaving home in the morning to humbly thank God for restoring his health and to ask that he be given an opportunity to help some unfortunate to a better life.
