

### Apartment Built in Barn



The apartment built in the upper story of this barn solved the problem of providing additional living space on the farm. The two-story building was featured in American Builder magazine. The exterior walls are a combination of masonry and stucco. Asphalt roof shingles, popular for both farm and urban structures, add a colorful touch. There are nearly 600 square feet of living space in the apartment, which has a modern living room with knotty pine finish. Living quarters are well-insulated from the barn and an efficient ventilating system was installed in the barn.
