Extension Circular No. 351, "Tobacco Insect Control in North Carolina," has just been published by the State College Extension Service and copies are available on request.

The publication gives information on insecticidal controls for tobacco insects in line with research results and experience available to February of this year. It was prepared by Henry K. Townes, research professor of entomology for the Agricultural Experiment Station.
