Graduates of the Morehead City Technical Institute, a branch of N. C. State College, have employment in a wide range of industries and occupations, a recent survey indicated. The Institute, now in its 3rd year of operation, offers fundamental training in various fields and attracts students from all sections of the State and from many parts of the nation.
