

Forestry Training Assists In Developing Good Citizenship

The pulpwood industry, through the Southern Pulpwood Conservation Association, for the 5th consecutive year is providing one week's camps where the care and wise use of forest trees will be taught to nearly 750 farm boys from 9 southern states. Members of the Association guarantee the expenses of these camps and are assisted in some instances by non-member pulp mills and in one state by the naval stores and lumber industries.

The Forestry Department in each state administers the camp and arranges for the staff to teach the forestry subjects. Boys selected to attend must earn that privilege by performing outstanding work during their school year on forestry projects either on their own woodlots or in school activities.

The boys learn fundamentals of good forest practices which they can apply to the management of their woodlands. In addition, they learn the association of the forest with their everyday lives and the important bearing it has on their economic and cultural future.

This year's Association sponsored camp in North Carolina will be administered by State Forester W. K. Beichler and will be held at Singletary Lake on the Bladen Lakes State Forest near Elizabethtown from August 7 through 12, with an attendance of 70 boys. The following pulp mills, all members of the SPCA, will finance the camp: The
