Onslow County or farther west than Alleghany and Mecklenberg. Only one out-of-State person was killed.

Three of the persons killed were pedestrians, 13 were passengers in autos, one a passenger on a motorcycle, carrying three people, and six were drivers. Six persons died in one accident, three in one and two in each of two accidents. The remainder accounted for single fatalities.

Nine fatal wrecks involved one vehicle; four, two vehicles; one, three vehicles. Fifteen vehicles were passenger cars; three were trucks; on motorcycle; and one, involved in a hit and run pedestrian fatality, was unknown.
