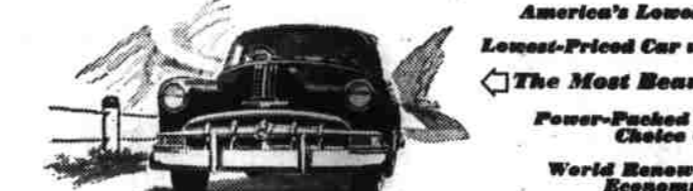

CHICAGO, ILL. — Chicago Superior Judge Rudolph F. Desort has ruled that the woman is the "sole and complete" boss of the American home. The judge handed down the ruling in the case of Mrs. Mildred Lussow, 35, who is seeking divorce from her husband Emil, 40, when Mrs. Lussow complained that a previous ruling arrangement that she remain in the home as "housekeeper" had failed to work out. The judge told Mrs. Lussow to try again and if Emil, who complained about meals and furniture arrangements, interfered, he would be held in contempt of court.
