ORIGINAL FT. RALEIGH BE RECONSTRUCTED

Manteo. — The original Fort Raleigh, an earthen structure, built in 1585 by Sir Walter Raleigh colonists under the leadership of Governor Ralph Lane will be reconstructed soon, it was announced this week by officials of the National Park Service. Fort Raleigh here on Roanoke Island is the actual landing place of the colonists and thus it is the birthplace of English-speaking America. The outlines of the original fort were discovered during 1948-49 by Archeologist J. C. Harrington of Richmond, and will supervise the re-construction. The re-constructed fort is expected to become a mess for history-loving tourists and for school children of the state and
