Thomas Jefferson rates an honored place in the gallery of "Inventions That Serve You." His greatness as a statesman overshadowed his distinction as an inventor. Invention of the swivel chair was one of his earliest achievements. His carriage "mileage computer" antedates the modern speedometer. A score of gadget inventions, including a combination table and chair, longus, may be seen in his Monticello home today. Jefferson, third President of the United States and author of the "Declaration of Independence," died on Independence Day, July 4, 1826.
